



# **Tower Project Newsletter: June 2015**

This is the second of the up-dates that we will publish on our major project.

Just to remind you - our lovely church (particularly the bell tower and the valley gutter between the two roofs) has been named as 'at risk' so we need to take urgent action. As we have told you before, we received a 'Grant for Places of Worship' from the Heritage Lottery Fund - development funding to survey and develop plans for the restoration of the tower and for 'reordering' of the inside of the church. The surveys have been carried out for essential work to the tower and roof, and plans for the reordering inside the church have been received. These are now available for your perusal:

Consultation: We have now displayed an A1 copy of the plans (of our aspirations) in the church – we have borrowed part of the Children's' Corner Notice Board - and we would like all of you to go in and see where we would like to put the toilet etc. We need your feedback, so we have put 'post-it' notes alongside the drawing. Please go into church and write your comments on a post-it and stick it to the drawing – thank you.

To remind you, what we would like to do is (in order of priority, in terms of funding):

Repair and restore the fabric of the tower and church valley gutter (roofing),

Reorder inside to make the church more flexible; including what we can afford from this list:

Provide a new toilet accessible to people with disabilities, with baby-changing facilities.

If we can afford it, we would also like to install a new kitchen that will fold away entirely, so that when it is not in use it will not even be recognisable as a kitchen. And if we can afford it:

We wish to move some of the box-wood pews around to make a more flexible space.

We would like to electrify the winding mechanism on the clock, and illuminate the clock face.

We would also like to improve the lighting and sound system in the church.

We are about to appoint a Quantity Surveyor to price up all the things we must do and these other reordering things that we would like to do. We will then know what we will be able to afford with the money we have already secured, and what more we have to raise – we will know where the gaps are.

Fund-raising. We are well on the way to our target, but still need to raise at least a further £8k, so the fund-raising is on-going:

A team will be running (or walking) the Ruby Run on 14th June – please sign a sponsor form.

A major tractor run, on 12<sup>th</sup> July, run by Alistair Kirk will start and end in Ashwater (with lunch).

Sale of 'merchandising' - watch out for cards, tea towels etc.

Adopting Sections of the Tower: We will be inviting you to 'adopt' a section of the tower. Each section will be numbered and be recognisable, to allow individuals / families to give us money to adopt – for example – a section of the stonework, a pinnacle, a window or a step in the staircase tower. Prices will range from £10 to £250 and names will be recorded for posterity, so you can choose who to commemorate in this way.
