CAMPAIGN TO PROTECT RURAL ENGLAND (CPRE)

2016 year will mark the 90th anniversary of CPRE as guardians of England's beautiful and irreplaceable country side and will see them looking even further forward to their Vision for the Countryside in 2026, the

centenary year.

During 2015 a number of successful campaigns were undertaken including persuading Government to set out long-term funding to increase cycling and walking. Ministers listened and now we're looking forward to the publication of the first Cycling and Walking Investment Strategy.

In June, we delivered our Charter to Save our Countryside to the Prime Minister, with more than 80,000 signatures. Alongside our Waste of Space campaign, this helped us influence the Government to announce incentives worth close to £1 billion to boost building on brown-field sites; regenerating our towns and cities, and helping to protect the countryside.

The year marked the 60th anniversary of England's Green Belts which limit urban sprawl and provide a breath of fresh air for millions of people living in towns and cities but are increasingly under pressure from development. Our members helped demonstrate how valuable and vital the Green Belt is by sharing stories and memories on Our Green Belt website, inspiring others to go out and enjoy it, too.

Just over three years ago, thousands campaigned with CPRE and the Break the Bag Habit coalition in writing to MPs and sending letters to local papers calling for a compulsory charge on plastic carrier bags. Finally, in early October a 5p bag charge came into force, an important step in helping to reduce litter that has shown results – an 80% drop in plastic bag use has already been reported by some supermarkets.

In past years the Devon branch of CPRE have organized the Best kept Village Competition but decided to take a break for 12 months whilst considering how to promote a new competition. Details are being finalized and will be issued early in 2016. There will also be a new map competition for primary schools to enter with suitable awards for the winners.

Locally the Torridge branch scrutinized a huge variety of planning applications and assisted with advice in other districts of Devon and Cornwall at the same time hosting a number of well attended seminars on a range of topics securing the services of Devon MP's and well known figures as speakers.

We hope you will celebrate with us in marking our 90th birthday as there will be a number of events held throughout 2016 with new initiatives covering research and topics of local, national and international interest and in the meantime CPRE wish you a very happy New Year.

DID YOU KNOW?

The recent introduction of wind turbines at Swingdon and Nethercott may appear as tall structures and have attracted some comment in the parish but, at 55m and 77m in height are small in comparison to the 2015 winners of the 'Onshore Turbine of the Year Awards' – the machine gaining "Gold" was 142.5m tall with a 130m rotor span and "Silver" was gained by a turbine 166m tall with a rotor span of 125m. Both rated at well over 3MW capacity. Even these however, are babies alongside the Vesta V164 with a rated capacity of 8.0 MW, an overall height of 220 m (722 ft) and a rotor diameter of 164m (538 ft). It is for offshore use although unlike others does not float (yes really, they float on a platform) – watch out Roadford Lake! Blades are getting longer and towers becoming taller, yet the ultimate design (for the moment) seems to be for kites mounted with turbines that fly autonomously generating power on a megawatt scale! What next in 2016? Turbines trailing behind passenger jets or underground in disused coal mines? You saw it here first!

The Parish Council kindly bears the cost of printing the newsletter with occasional donations of ink from readers. Others have also donated regular supplies of paper or give up their time to deliver hard copies throughout the parish – thank you all concerned. Currently we have created 12 jobs and believe with local support this could build to over thirty within 12 months. As we succeed and grow further we will in turn, support local charities and worthwhile causes".
